In D's mind, he wasn't tough or inspirational, he was just a kid trying not to let cancer define him. I'm not sure Dalton would have even run in his own 5K. He and I ran a 5K once together, shortly before his diagnosis, and after finishing, Dalton looked at me and proclaimed "I'm never doing that again!" However, I bet he wouldn't mind riding his bike, skateboard, or even golf cart for most of the way and then hopping over the finish line on one leg. That's certainly more of Dalton's style. Unlike running, D very much wanted to skydive. We tried to take him but jumpers have to be 18 years old. So, trying to be brave like D and so many other kids, D-Feet Cancer is going skydiving on Sunday August 6th. It's something Jen and I never thought we would do but we continue to be inspired by Dalton, Chloe, Omar, Jordyn and kids like them. Research

In this research project called "Circumventing Ewing Sarcoma Antigen Heterogeneity by ILIRAP and B7-H3 Dual-Targeting Bispecific Antibody Drug Conjugates," Dr. Li and colleagues are trying to develop better medicines to treat Ewing sarcoma. Ewing sarcoma is a type of cancer that has different subtypes, and they want to create drugs (antibody drug conjugates or ADCs) that can target and destroy Ewing sarcoma cells, even when they have different markers on the surface of the cancer cells, while also minimizing side effects.

To do this, they are focusing on two specific targets on Ewing sarcoma cells called IL1RAP and B7-H3. Their first goal is to make the drug less toxic, so it doesn't harm healthy cells too much. They have made good progress with this aim so far by developing antibody drug conjugates showing more safe profiles in preliminary lab tissue culture tests. Further testing on mouse models is undergoing and planned.

The second goal is to create a drug that can target both IL1RAP and another target called CD276 at the same time. This would make the drug more effective against different types of Ewing sarcoma. They are currently planning and preparing experiments for this aim, and will have more updates in the coming months.





The 2nd Annual Dalton's Dash 5k was held on May 20, 2023. Over 275 runners gathered at the starting line, representing a united community committed to fighting pediatric cancer and Ewing Sarcoma. The race raised just under \$12,000 and the event's success was made possible by the dedicated efforts of volunteers, sponsors, and organizers. Participants and spectators enjoyed music from DJ Steve, cupcakes in a jar, and a raffle. The community's generosity and support made a tangible impact on the lives of those affected. The 2nd annual Dalton's Dash 5k embodies the spirit of compassion and determination in the face of adversity. The event's success brings us one step closer to a future where no child faces cancer alone. The Dalton Fox Foundation extends gratitude to all participants, volunteers, sponsors, and supporters for their vital contributions.
